FROM THE DESK OF EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR BART GIESLER

I want to thank everyone who helped make our first EV training by Energy Security Agency (ESA) a success. President Sue Moreland found them at a tow show that she was at, which started the relationship that began with a presentation at the Annual meeting, then the May training, and will continue with two (2) different presentations at the Tow Show. In order to put these events on, at an affordable price, we have to have sponsors to offset the cost. Indiana Lien and Hedingers were class sponsors, which allowed us to lower the registration cost. We want to thank our sponsors who paid for breakfast, lunch, snacks, and drinks throughout the all-day training. Special thanks to Kapnick Insurance, Double T Towing, Auto Data Direct, D-1 Towing, Wichert Insurance, AAA Hoosier Motor Club, I 70 Wrecker Service, and Road Sync.

We are having a 4-hour class at the show that will cost \$99 for members of ITWA or another state towing association. For non-members the cost is \$150.

I don't know when EVs will make up the majority of cars on the road, but it will take several years for this to happen. The average age of a car on the road is 12.2 years and the average age of EVs on the road is 3.8 years. I am sure that Indiana is behind the curve on consumer EV adoption. Even though it will take years for EVs to become the majority of the cars on the road, there are some now and we must be prepared. Here are some of my big takeaways from the training:

EVs are heavier. Can your equipment handle it?

EVs that have no power cannot be put into neutral. How are you going to handle this?

EVs with damaged batteries are dangerous for an extended period of time. EVs that have been submerged have a higher risk of battery fires. How are you going to account for this in your storage lot?

Police and fire departments are not yet trained on how to handle EVs. Therefore, be prepared to assume that they will want to get the car out of there as fast as possible, without knowing the risks. Take the time to work with your police and fire departments about the risks when you can sit down in the office and have the discussion versus trying to have the discussion roadside. The better we all work together, the safer it is for everyone. Please share the upcoming training opportunity with your local departments.

We don't have all the answers – and we won't have all the answers for several years, as things will change. This doesn't mean we sit back and wait until the dust settles. It means we need to understand that there are safety issues and we must deal with them the best we can. It's no different than how the industry has improved safety with the combustible engine.

The newsletter has lots of information on the Tow Show, so please take the time to review everything. There will be changes as we get closer.

DOT CHAT WITH BRENT HOOVER



Hello and welcome back! My name is Brent Hoover. I am a Master Trooper with the ISP. I am assigned to the Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Division or CVED for short. My primary daily duty is to enforce the State and Federal Regulations for CMVs in the State of Indiana. I am certified to complete Part A and B Inspections, as well as General Haz-mat and Cargo Tank inspections. I am also a Part B Instructor for the National Training Center, which means I teach new inspectors how to inspect and document level 1 inspections. I have competed twice in the North American Inspectors Championships. I am the current administrator of the CVED Facebook page, where I post about tips and tricks to improve your pre-trip inspections and to avoid common roadside violations.

This month I would like to talk a little bit about lug nuts. How often do you check your lug nuts? Looking at the photo below how many missing or loose lug nuts can you see? Let's look at the regulations and the Out of Service criteria.

393.205 Wheels



- (a) Wheels and rims shall not be cracked or broken.
- (b) Stud or bolt holes on the wheels shall not be elongated (out of round).
- (c) Nuts or bolts shall not be missing or loose.

g. Wheel Fasteners

Loose, missing, broken, cracked or stripped wheel fasteners that are ineffective as follows: for 10 fastener positions - 3 anywhere or 2 adjacent; for 8 fastener positions or less - 2 anywhere (this applies to both spoke and disk wheels). (393.205(c))

So, as you can see any missing or loose lug nut is a violation and it takes several missing to count towards the OOS Criteria. If you have any other questions, please feel free to contact me at bhoover@isp.in.gov

LEGAL UPDATE: WHEN DOES THE MCS-90 ENDORSEMENT PAY?

Have you ever wondered how to get paid for towing and recovery services when a motor carrier's insurer denies coverage for towing services? The MCS-90 endorsement offers one solution. This month's update focuses on a recent decision from the Indiana Supreme Court which addresses the scope of the MCS-90 endorsement.

First, what is the point of the MCS-90 endorsement? Motor carriers can add an MCS-90 endorsement to their insurance policy to demonstrate compliance with minimum levels of financial responsibility set by federal regulations. The MCS-90 endorsement is essentially a safety net. It requires an insurance company to pay a final judgment against the insured (the motor carrier) for "public liability" resulting from negligence. "Public liability" includes liability for bodily injury, property damage, and environmental restoration.

Though this may sound like just another way for the insurance company to charge higher premiums, the MCS-90 endorsement can play an important role in getting towing companies paid—it applies in instances where the insurance policy would not. For example, if a motor carrier forgets to add a driver or truck to their commercial auto policy (a common reason insurers deny claims), the MCS-90 endorsement kicks in to provide coverage, which could include paying the towing bill and the cost of cleaning up spills. This endorsement can be an extremely valuable tool for towing companies responding to semi-tractor accidents, particularly if it results in off-road damage or a release of materials onto the ground that the towing company cleans up.

The issue in the recent Indiana Supreme Court case, *Progressive Southeastern Insurance Company v. Brown*, was whether the MCS-90 endorsement applied to claims against an "**intrastate carrier of non-hazardous property**" who had failed to add a driver and truck to its insurance policy. The Court held that it did not, finding that this endorsement only applies when a motor carrier (1) transports property in interstate commerce (between two or more states), or (2) transports hazardous property.

The Main Takeaway for Your Business: The MCS-90 endorsement is a safety net that can help ensure tow companies are paid for their services. If an insurer denies coverage for towing services, you should push back if the policy has an MCS-90 endorsement. But if the motor carrier is only transporting non-hazardous property between two locations in the State of Indiana, the MCS-90 endorsement will not apply. In those situations, you will need to seek alternative routes to recover your costs.

I want to thank the ITWA for welcoming my law firm as an associate member and Bart Giesler for inviting me to submit legal update articles for Hook & Winch.





ITWA BOARD OF DIRECTORS MINUTES

March 23, 2022 – Zoom

President Moreland called the meeting to order at 6:03 pm.

Participating in the meeting: Sue Moreland, Crystal Rose, Ken Parish, Josh Bell, Karrie Driscoll, Joey Driscoll, Walt Hamilton, Josh Hercamp, Jim Steele, Diana Bell, Loyal Bell, and Bart Giesler.

The minutes from the November 2 minutes were presented. A motion was made to approve by Walt Hamilton and 2nd by Sue Moreland. Motion carried.

Treasurer Hamilton presented the financial report. Assets were \$193,301.82 and net revenue to date was \$18,471.74. A motion to approve the treasurer's report was made by Sue Moreland and 2nd by Karrie Driscoll. Motion carried.

President Moreland discussed the possible Electric Vehicle training that would be offered by Energy Security Agency in May. The cost would be \$10,000 plus travel expenses. After discussion, Walt Hamilton made a motion to enter into contract with ESA and it was 2nd by Jim Steele. Motion Carried.

Bart Giesler discussed the 2022 session and upcoming primary elections. There were attempts to eliminate the use of a certificate mailing that ITWA was able to defeat. President Moreland brought up that BMV stopped processing business transactions at their local branch. If anyone hears about more of these restrictions, please let her or Bart know.

The 2022 Tow Show will be August 5-6. The show will start earlier on Friday at 11:00 am. President Moreland has several speakers from compliance, EV and towing safety, legal, succession planning and asset protection. Dianna Bell has agreed to do another t-shirt quilt for the Survivor Fund. There will be a silent auction – Women's Lunch and multiple activities. Bart Giesler commented that President Moreland has done a great job of getting exhibitors and sponsors, but everyone needs to help in asking vendors to participate and encouraging other towing companies to attend.

President Moreland reported that the Annual Meeting will be December 3 at the Double Tree in Lafayette. More details will be coming later.

Crystal Rose reported that the Ladies Auxiliary was working hard and providing energy to the association by supporting the upcoming EV training class, Tow Show and Christmas Party. The group is always needing more people and ideas.

President Moreland discussed if we needed to have By-Law changes limiting the amount of people from one company that can be on the Board of Directors. There are not any issues now, but there may be a possibility in the future that one company may be perceived as having too much power over the Association. The By-Laws are silent and the industry has changed over the years as some companies have multiple locations or own multiple companies or a combination of both. There was discussion that we voted for people – not companies. Everyone agreed that there were multiple scenarios and a group should be formed to look into the issue. Josh Hercamp made a motion to form a committee and the motion was 2nd by Karrie Driscoll. Motion Carried.

President Moreland asked Josh Hercamp to form a committee and report back to the Board by the Trade Show for discussion.

After some open discussion, Jim Steele made a motion to adjourn and 2nd by Walt Hamilton. Motion carried.

Meeting adjourned at 7:15 pm.



