FROM THE DESK OF EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR BART GIESLER

I wanted to give everyone an update on my garden. I am still waiting on tomatoes and I think I should be getting close. The Governor has called the Legislature back for a special session. They are planning on making changes to the abortion law as a result of the recent Supreme Court ruling. The primary reason the Governor called them back was to address the state's \$6.1 billion surplus. The Governor wants to give taxpayers \$225 refund. The Senate has proposed temporarily eliminating the sales tax on utilities and reducing the gas tax. They also plan to pay down additional debt. The House has yet to officially release its plan, but it is expected to be similar to the Governor's proposal. ITWA does not expect any legislation that will directly impact the towing business, other than the temporary tax cuts or taxpayer refunds.

There are 17 legislators who will not be back next session because of retirement or because they lost in the primary. As a result of re-districting, you may have new legislators as well. Please take time to meet your legislators and discuss what you do. If you don't tell them, they will never know about the difficulties that you face to make sure the roads are cleared of wrecked vehicles.

I look forward to seeing everyone at the Show. Please let me know if there is anything that you would like ITWA to be working on.

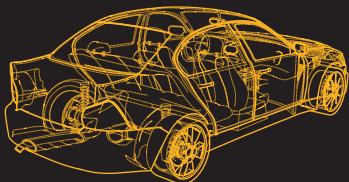



Have you considered accessing the local Abandoned Vehicle Account to pay for towing services?

My name is Ryan Leagre and I am an attorney at Plews Shadley Racher & Braun LLP. I represent towing companies in various capacities, including helping them to recover the costs of responding to large accidents and navigating statutes and ordinances that regulate the industry.

This month's update focuses on the pros and cons of the Abandoned Vehicle Statute, which requires cities and counties to pay towing invoices when the owner of the vehicle does not claim the vehicle. The two relevant provisions are quoted below:

I.C. § 9-22-1-25. The costs for removal and storage of an abandoned vehicle or parts not claimed by the person who owns or holds a lien on a vehicle shall be paid from the abandoned vehicle account established under section 30 The charge payable by the person who owns or holds a lien on a vehicle for towing, storing, or removing an abandoned vehicle or parts may not exceed the limits established by ordinance adopted under section 30

I.C. § 9-22-1-30. (a) The fiscal body shall, by ordinance, establish procedures to carry out this chapter, including the following: (1) The charges allowed for towing and storage of abandoned vehicles, which shall be filed with the bureau; (2) The means of disposition of vehicles. (b) The fiscal body shall establish an abandoned vehicle fund for the purposes of this chapter.

Read together, these statutes require a fiscal body (city or county) to (1) set up an abandoned vehicle fund, (2) establish procedures for this fund, including setting the allowable charges, and (3) pay the allowable charges from the towing invoice when the owner of the vehicle does not claim the vehicle. On its face, this fund could be a useful way to recover at least a portion of unpaid invoices in situations where the vehicle owner or their insurer has refused to pay the bill and the prospects of recovering damages in court look dim.

There are at least two drawbacks. First, as far as I can tell, most fiscal bodies (maybe as many as 99%) do not even have an abandoned vehicle account or the ordinances required by Section 30. In order to utilize this fund, you may need to go to the appropriate fiscal body to have the fund created. Second, accessing the fund could be a double-edged sword because Section 25 allows the fiscal body to set the caps for recoverable charges. The fiscal body could set caps that make it impossible for towing companies to recover on large accidents where costs can be in the tens of thousands.

The Main Takeaway for Your Business: You should consider whether it is worth pursuing your local fiscal body about the Abandoned Vehicle Account to recover some costs of abandoned vehicles. If enough members are interested, the ITWA may be able to help.

KEY EMPLOYEES: CHEAPER TO KEEP THAN TO REPLACE

Recruiting good people and keeping them is a struggle all employers face. If you want your operation to run smoothly, you need good people you can trust in important positions. For most businesses, that means there are a handful of key employees that would be very difficult, if not impossible, to replace. Sometimes those people are family, but often they are simply great employees who share your vision and want to see your business succeed. So, what can an employer do to help ensure that their best people stay with them, and what can they do to insulate the company against the losses that would occur if that person was to become too sick or hurt to work for an extended period of time?

First, it's important to understand the value of key people. The Society of Human Resource Management reported that the cost to replace a skilled employee is generally about 6-9 months of their salary. For your key people, it could be more than that if they are your connection to certain contracts, or they manage a technical part of your administrative duties. Retaining those key people costs far less to the business in terms of operational efficiency and opportunity cost than simply what they earn. Unfortunately, in order to keep the best people, companies can no longer rely on group benefits like health insurance, 401Ks, and vacation time. These are expected benefits that they can get anywhere they work, so employers are finding they have to get more creative to offer incentives that cause great people to stay where they are.

One key component to key employee retention is creating an incentive that is enticing, but also delayed. If you want an employee to stay around for 10 years, a 10-year stay bonus can be an attractive option. The bonus must be large enough to offset any competitor's offer of higher wages, but affordable enough to fit into the business budget.

Another concern for the business is what would happen if your key person was to get sick or hurt and not be able to work again, maybe permanently. In this case, a series of key employee insurance policies can help offset the lost revenue the company will likely experience.

When built correctly, a combination of a permanent life insurance policy and a disability insurance policy can both create a tax efficient, fully deferred bonus for the employee and protect the company from losses incurred due to loss of a key person. This includes the owner of the business, as most businesses would suffer greatly from the loss of a partner, even if that person isn't the majority owner. These can often be offered for far less than the cost of replacing the employee.


