each chamber, each chamber will have new members. Some of the new ones defeated previous members while others won open seats. They all bring a different perspective based on their own life experiences. I often get asked, “How do you deal with it?” I think the answer is simple – I know the rules of the game. I may not like them, but I know what they are. I think this is probably true for most of you. How do you deal with angry customers; how do you get up in the middle of the night to help out a stranger to fix one of their mistakes? We just all deal with it.

As far as session, I won’t know what bills are out there until mid-January after the filing deadline has passed. This is a budget year and the state is expected to receive more than a billion in “new” revenue. The problem is that with inflation, the state’s costs are expected to rise by a similar number leaving relatively no new revenue for additional programs. The legislature and the Governor’s office will have different ideas and these differences won’t get resolved until the last days of session in late April. ITWA will send out periodic legislative updates throughout session. If you have any relations with your legislators, please let ITWA know. Speaking of legislators, I need to thank Rep. Terri Austin who was defeated in November. She was always helpful for ITWA. She offered various amendments for us over the years and always was there for us.

INDOT BUDGET PRESENTATION

As was previously mentioned, this year is a budget year and state agencies make presentations to the State Budget Committee. In reviewing INDOT’s presentation, they discussed Work Zone Safety. As part of their efforts to improve safety, they mentioned:

Partnering with Indiana State Police;

Supporting Hands Free Driving Laws; and

Continuing to study automated Queue Warning and Haas Alert systems.

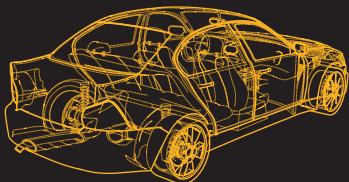
They stated that an analysis of nearly 430 hours of queuing showed 80% reduction in hard-braking events when queue warning trucks were present. Even with this reduction, INDOT reported that in the first 9 months of 2022, there were 5,332 work zone and work zone queue crashes, resulting in 1,091 injuries and 25 deaths.

ITWA recently was contacted for input by Sen. Braun’s office, which is also working on a National Work Zone Awareness resolution. ITWA looks to work with anyone who wants to improve roadside safety. As we pointed out in our reply, the Move Over Law in work zones will allow accidents to be removed quicker, because we have more room to work safely. That, in turn, allows the roadway to be opened up quicker, which prevents secondary accidents in the queue.


Working along the road is dangerous for everyone. We need to continue to work with other groups to highlight the danger.

DOT CHAT WITH BRENT HOOVER



Hello and welcome back! If you are new to the column I would like to take a minute and bring you up to speed on who I am. My name is Brent Hoover. I am a Master Trooper with the Indiana State Police. I have started my 19th year with the ISP. I am assigned to the Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Division or CVED for short. My primary daily duty is to enforce the State and Federal Regulations for CMVs in the State of Indiana. I am certified to complete Part A and B Inspections as well as General Haz-mat and Cargo Tank inspections. I am also a Part B Instructor for the National Training Center, which means I teach new inspectors how to inspect and document Level 1 Inspections. I have competed twice in the North American Inspectors Championships. I am the current administrator of the CVED Facebook page where I post about tips and tricks to improve your pre-trip inspections and to avoid common roadside violations.

This month I would like to take a moment and talk to you about cracks!!! We all know that a crack is never a good thing. So, we are going to look at cracks in a rim!

According to FMCSA Regulation 393.205:



- (a) Wheels and rims shall not be cracked or broken
- (b) Stud or bolt holes on the wheels shall not be elongated (out of round).
- (c) Nuts or bolts shall not be missing or loose.

The Out of Service criteria states:

Rim Cracks

Any circumferential crack. (393.205(a))

Disc Wheel Cracks

- (1) Any crack exceeding 3 inches (76.2 mm) in length. (393.205(a))
- (2) A crack extending between any two holes (hand holes, stude holes and center holes.) (393.205(a))
- (3) Two or more cracks anywhere on the wheel. (393.205(a))

A motion to approve the 2021 Annual Minutes by Walt Hamilton and seconded by Sue Moreland. Motion carried.

President Report – President Sue Moreland decided to skip this section due to the topics already being listed on the agenda that she had planned to cover.

Secretary – Treasurer Report was prepared and presented by Walt Hamilton and distributed. Current assets are \$190,051.80. Karrie Driscol made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report, which was seconded by Loyal Bell. Motion carried.

The Legislative preview was presented by Bart Giesler. Rep. Jim Pressel – Laporte, Indiana BMV, Secretary of State's office was present when asking about a possible increase of storage for electric vehicles. The consensus among the group was they did not feel many companies would be abiding by the 50 ft. rule and there were no changes that needed to be made to storage limits with electric vehicles. Bart is still working with legislators to hold insurance companies accountable for dumping vehicles on towing companies. Lastly, Bart is working on getting the newspaper rates switched from what they are now to a lower governmental rate for newspaper notices when it pertains to vehicles impounded by request of law enforcement. Legislatures will be in session from January through April this year.

Christmas Party – Sue Moreland the Christmas Party for 2023 will be at DoubleTree in Lafayette, IN on December 2, 2023.

2023 Calendars – Sue Moreland the proofs were received on Friday and the calendars will be sent out in the next couple of weeks.

2023 Tow Show – Sue Moreland/Crystal Rose the 2023 Tow Show will be held at the Boone County Fairgrounds in Lebanon, IN on August 18 and 19th, 2023. Due to there not being any hotels on sight, the association was working on shuttles. A committee was formed to oversee a driving competition, which is comprised of Ken Parrish, Scott Garrett and Joey Driscol. It was decided that the ladies luncheon would also be held on site and Crystal Rose asked for help with the menu planning for the ladies luncheon. Karrie Driscol volunteered to help oversee the menu planning for the meal with help from Karey Crone. There will be more details available as plans are established.

ITWA Succession planning was presented by Sue Moreland and Bart Giesler. There are many executive committee seats that are going to be coming available next year. President, Treasurer, VP North are expected to be available, and there could always be others as well. The Treasurer's duties encompass many different responsibilities and a plan on how to delegate some of those responsibilities to other members of the executive committee was discussed. The need for someone

who will be able to take the position for a minimum of 5 years and a history within the association was also discussed. These topics will be discussed throughout the year as the committee determines the best path forward for our success in the future for our association.

Frick 2023 Contract – Bart Giesler of Frick and Associates has verbally requested an increase of \$4,000 annually. This was discussed and determined that Frick and Associates have not received a raise in 8 years. There was a discussion about whether to vote on the raise at the meeting. Sue Moreland, President, stated she had not received anything in writing and Crystal Rose, VP North, stated she was not willing to vote on the increase at this time as it was a rushed decision and the ITWA was not presented with a written proposal. A committee was selected to review the request. The committee would include the executive committee, JR Cook, Mickey Hercamp, and Bill McClannahan. A vote was made for the approval of the \$4000.00 increase, pending the review of the contract by the executive committee and special committee, (as named above). The motion carried.

Vice President North – Crystal Rose




